Legal Updates - how did we get here?

Two court cases -


Austin - challenged mask requirements and close contact quarantining for asymptomatic Allen - challenged vaccine requirements OR weekly testing requirements for unvaccinated staff

Last week-Attorney General filed a motion to "stay" of the TRO and appeal on Sangamon rulings.

- 2/4/22–Governor Pritzker extended the Executive Order until 3/6/22.
- 2/9/22–Governor Pritzker announced that State of Illinois will lift the indoor mask mandate on 2/28/22, with schools being excluded from this at this point.
- No further legal action at this point, including any decisions on the stay or the appeal (anticipated 2/17/22).
- Federal requirements for masks on school transportation remain in place as part of broader public transportation requirements.


Multiple Layers Improve Success



Options	Aligned Board Action

2. Shift to "masks strongly recommended but not required" in buildings, quarantining "requested but not required" for asymptomatic/COVID negative close contacts, no required weekly testing for unvaccinated staff. Local metrics/plan would drive any changes in mitigations.	Resolution
3. Remain status quo with current mitigations in place pending further legal guidance/changes to the Executive Order.	No action needed



Conditional Mitigation Procedures: A Guideline

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Masking Definitions

Universal Masking

All staff, students, and visitors wear masks on Gavin 37 transportation and while indoors at all times, regardless of vaccination status.

• Situational Masking

Masks will be worn at the following times:

- While being transported on a bus
- In hallways
- During band, choir, and physical education (when indoors)
- During instructional activities in which social distancing may not be maintained and when a large number of people are gathered in an indoor space (i.e., assemblies, performances)
- Recommended, Not Required, Masking

Staff, students and visitors choose to wear masks while indoors when mask requirements are lifted. There may be situations in which masking will be required due to isolated increases in cases.

Guidelines - Phased Masking Approach

Percentages Are 5-Day Averages (percentages are guidelines for potential movement between masking expectations.)

Universal Masking

- If Executive Order or a "stay" is in place
- Vaccination rates, Hospitalizations, or Building Transmission Rates indicate a need for a change
- Greater than 2.0% building positivity rate in a school building
- Classroom, Grade Level, Club, Sport Activity have a spike in cases and masking is necessary
- Current IDPH guidelines are in place for all students/staff who test positive with COVID-19 or are close contacts with a positive case.



Guidelines - Phased Masking Approach

• Situational Masking

- From 1.25% to 2.0% building positivity rate
- Current IDPH guidelines are in place for all students/staff who test positive with COVID-19 or are close contacts with a positive case.



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Guidelines - Phased Masking Approach



- Recommended, Not Required, Masking
 - Building positivity rate of less than 1.25%
 - Contact tracing will be completed with quarantine recommended for close contacts.





Example: Central (473 students)

10 or more average weekly cases

Universal Masking (UM) Greater than 2% building positivity rate

6 - 9 - average weekly cases Situational Masking (SM) From 1.25% to 2.0% building positivity rate

0 - 5 average weekly cases

Recommended, Not Required, Masking (RM) Less than 1.25% building positivity rate

Percentages Are 5-Day Averages. Percentages are guidelines for potential movement between masking expectations.



Example: South (330 students)

7 or more average weekly cases

Universal Masking (UM) Greater than 2% building positivity rate

5 - 6 average weekly cases Situational Masking (SM) From 1.25% to 2.0% building positivity rate

0 - 4 average weekly cases

Recommended, Not Required, Masking (RM) Less than 1.25% building positivity rate
