### **Legal Updates**

- 2/14/22—Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) did not re-approve the IDPH rules that expired. These rules supported the Executive Order on mitigations. By not re-upping them, enforcement of the Executive Order was weakened.
- 2/17/22—The Court of Appeals ruled that, the appeal of the temporary restraining order (TRO) issued by Judge Grischow on February 4th is "moot" (meaning, the lower court's decision was upheld)
- Although executive orders also remain in place at the moment, the State continues to be restrained from taking enforcement action against school districts about requirements for face coverings, close contact exclusions, and COVID-19 vaccination or testing.
- An appeal has been filed to the Illinois Supreme Court likely not to be heard until next school year




### **Mitigation Updates**

- Gavin 37 Board of Education passed a resolution to shift mitigation based on local metrics
  - Shift to "masks strongly recommended but not required" in buildings,
  - Quarantining "requested but not required" for asymptomatic/COVID negative close contacts,
  - No required weekly testing for unvaccinated staff.
- Local metrics/plan developed to drive any changes in mitigations
- \*Positive cases still require isolation and masking on days 6-10
- \*Masks continue to be required on public transportation based on federal guidelines




### **Multiple Layers Improve Success**

### **Masking Definitions**



Staff, students and visitors choose to wear masks while indoors when mask requirements are lifted. There may be situations in which masking will be required due to isolated increases in cases.





### **Masking Definitions**

#### Situational Masking

Masks will be worn at the following times:

- While being transported on a bus
- In hallways
- During band, choir, and physical education (when indoors)
- During instructional activities in which social distancing may not be maintained and when a large number of people are gathered in an indoor space (i.e., assemblies, performances)

#### Recommended, Not Required, Masking

Staff, students and visitors choose to wear masks while indoors when mask requirements are lifted. There may be situations in which masking will be required due to isolated increases in cases.







### **Masking Definitions**

#### Universal Masking

All staff, students, and visitors wear masks on Gavin 37 transportation and while indoors at all times, regardless of vaccination status.



#### Situational Masking

Masks will be worn at the following times:

- While being transported on a bus
- In hallways
- During band, choir, and physical education (when indoors)
- During instructional activities in which social distancing may not be maintained and when a large number of people are gathered in an indoor space (i.e., assemblies, performances)

### **Guidelines - Phased Masking Approach**

Percentages Are 5-Day Averages (percentages are guidelines for potential movement between masking expectations.)

### Universal Masking

- Greater than 2.0% building positivity rate
- If Executive Order or a "stay" is in place
- Vaccination rates, Hospitalizations, or Building
   Transmission Rates indicate a need for a change
- Classroom, Grade Level, Club, Sport Activity have a spike in cases and masking is necessary
- Current IDPH guidelines are in place for all students/staff who test positive with COVID-19 or are close contacts with a positive case.



### **Guidelines - Phased Masking Approach**

### Situational Masking

- From 1.25% to 2.0% building positivity rate
- Current IDPH guidelines are in place for all students/staff who test positive with COVID-19 or are close contacts with a positive case.






### **Guidelines - Phased Masking Approach**

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- Recommended, Not Required, Masking
  - Building positivity rate of less than 1.25%
  - Contact tracing will be completed with quarantine recommended for close contacts.





### **Example: Central (473 students)**

### 10 or more average weekly cases

Universal Masking (UM)
Greater than 2% building positivity rate

### 6 - 9 - average weekly cases

Situational Masking (SM) From 1.25% to 2.0% building positivity rate

### 0 - 5 average weekly cases

Recommended, Not Required, Masking (RM) Less than 1.25% building positivity rate

Universal Masking (UM)
Greater than 2% building positivity rate

### 5 - 6 average weekly cases

Situational Masking (SM)
From 1.25% to 2.0% building positivity rate


### 0 - 4 average weekly cases
