

COVID-19 Mitigations and the Test-to-Stay Program





CURRENT COVID MITIGATIONS IN PLACE AT GAVIN 37

- Three feet of social distancing when properly masked, to the best extent possible.
- Six feet of social distancing when not able to be masked (i.e. lunch), to the best extent possible.
- Use of face coverings per IL Governor's Executive Order.
- Frequent hand washing
- Weekly Shield Testing: Gavin 37 has a partnership with Shield Illinois to provide weekly COVID tests to staff and students. Parental consent is required for students.
- ۲ Multiple vaccination clinics for age 12+ at Grant Community High School and for age 5-11 at Gavin Central.
- Test-to-Stay program: In coordination with the Lake County Department of Public Health, Gavin 37 was a part of a pilot,

"Test-to-Stay" program that allowed many of our students to stay in school rather than quarantine when identified as a close contact to someone with COVID-19. We are happy that hundreds of students have avoided

quarantining and qualified for Test-to-Stay to remain in school as long as they are negative for COVID.

- Isolation and Exclusion: As of Jan. 11, COVID-positive students and unvaccinated close contacts who don't qualify for Test-to-Stay can return to school after five days as long as they are fever free for 24 hours and have improved symptoms. Close contacts are defined as within three feet of a positive individual for 15 minutes or more in a 24-hour period when properly masked or within six feet of a positive individual for 15 minutes or more in a 24-hour period when not properly masked. Vaccinated (and boosted) individuals do not need to quarantine. Prior to Jan. 11, 10 day isolation and quarantine periods were required.
- School personnel proof of vaccination or weekly testing: Per mandate, all school personnel are required to provide proof of vaccination or agree to weekly testing.



Leader in Me® Program Launches

Leader in Me[®] is a comprehensive, school improvement model and social-emotional learning program that equips students with essential leadership and life-readiness skills.

The model impacts leadership, culture and academics. It is based on the book: *7 Habits of Highly Effective People* by Steven Covey. Gavin Central is in the first year of implementation.

Students learn principles that help them become active, engaged partners in their own learning and develop skills in the areas of self-confidence, responsibility and initiative. Over time, students also build community by working together and motivating one another.

The "7 Habits Tree" (shown above) as part of the Leader in Me[®] paradigm, outlines the seven basic tenets (the 7 Habits) of the program that are explicitly taught to our students over time.

Use of Federal and State Grant Dollars

Gavin 37 works diligently to maximize state and federal grant opportunities to support our educational goals. Over the past 18 months, there has been additional funding from the federal government designed to help districts navigate the unexpected expenses related to mitigating the spread of COVID-19.

Gavin 37 has benefited greatly from these additional funds and have dedicated much of them to support student learning. Below is an overview of the ways in which we have spent these supplemental funds.
