This work aligns directly to our mission to prepare all students for future success by fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and communication skills. Additional priorities include reducing chronic absenteeism through targeted interventions and strengthening our early childhood program, now entering its second year, to support school readiness and long-term student success.

All Tier Funding is aligned to the Evidence-Based Funding cost factors. Investments directly support staffing, professional development, and instructional resources that advance our strategic goals. This includes continued implementation of the High Reliability Schools framework (Levels I and II) through the Marzano Institute, professional learning in Kagan cooperative learning structures to strengthen student engagement, targeted interventions to reduce chronic absenteeism, and resources to expand our early childhood program in its second year. All expenditures are tied to improving student outcomes and meeting identified needs.
